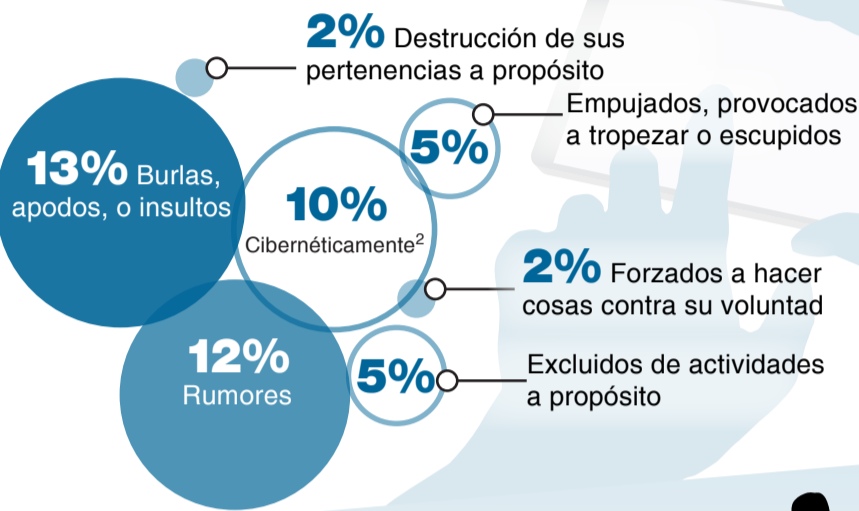
¿QUÉ es el Acoso Escolar?

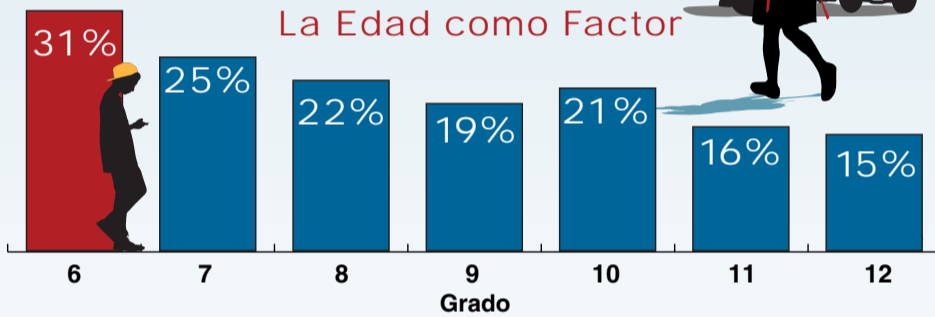


1 de cada 5 Niños/as es Acosado en la Escuela¹

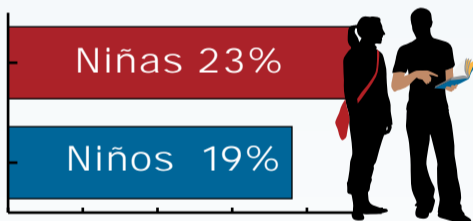

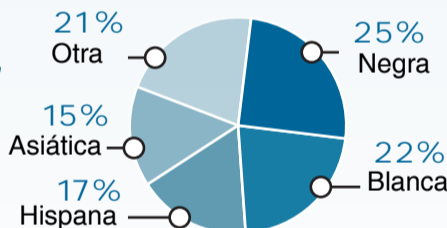
